- Mental health is increasingly recognized as a resource for life and health.
- Mental health and physical health are thoroughly intertwined and inseparable: Holistic conception of health.

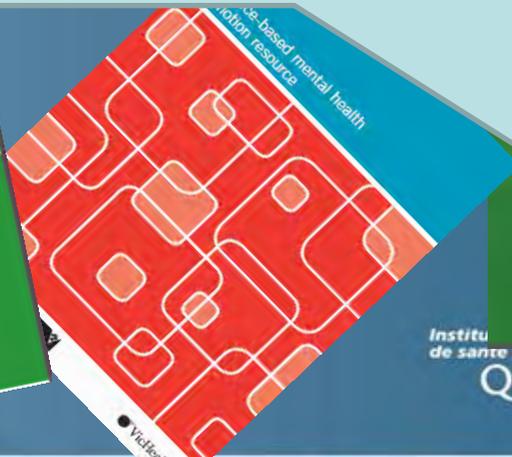
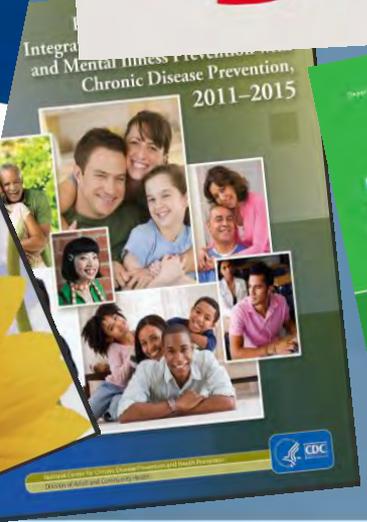
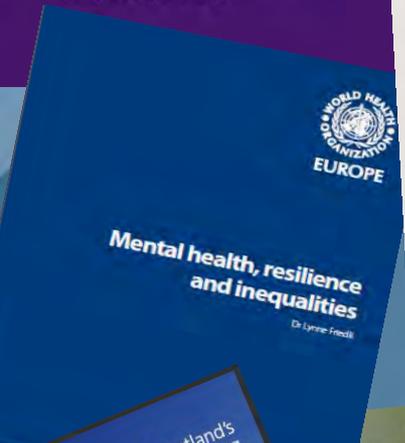


No health without mental health

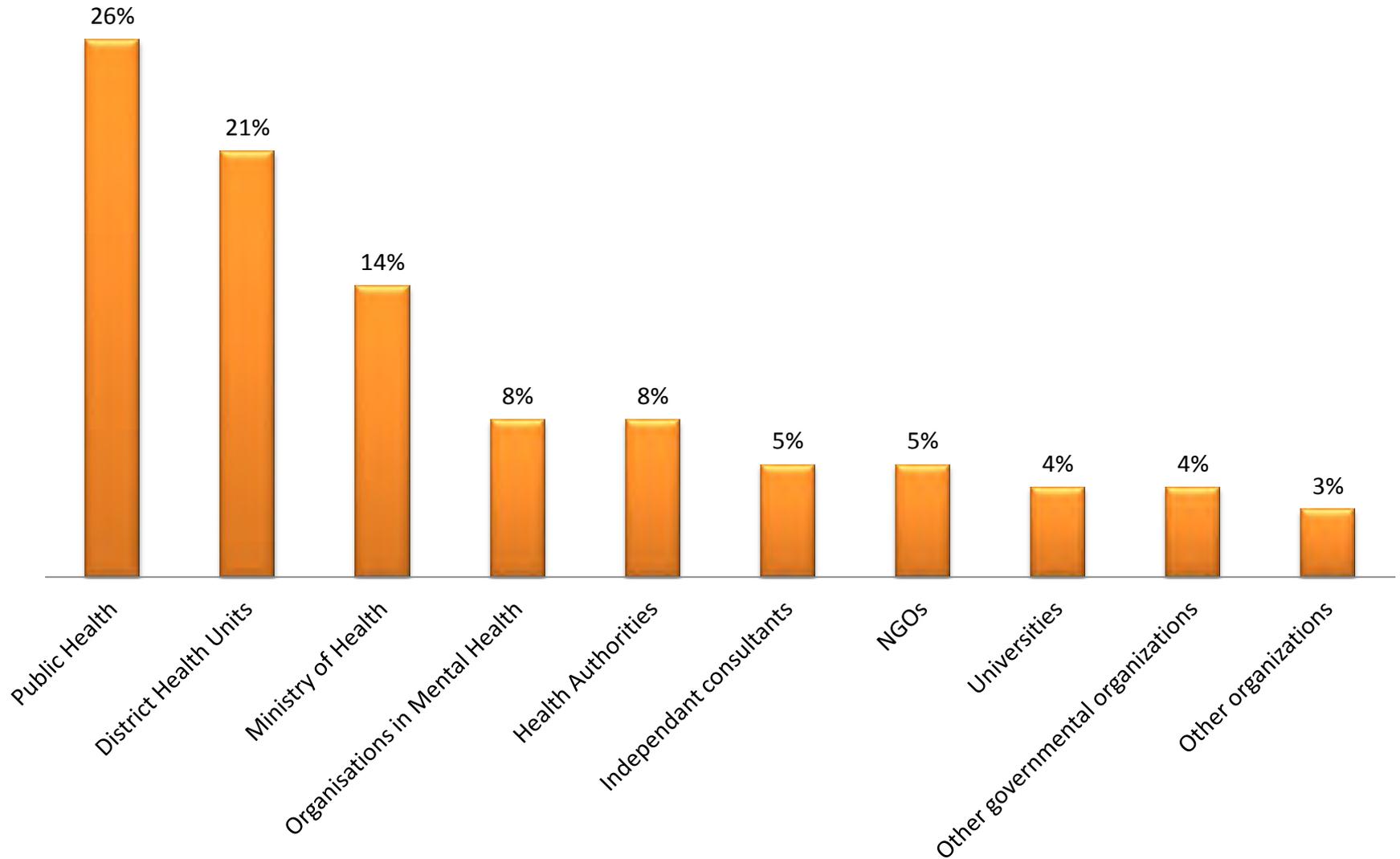

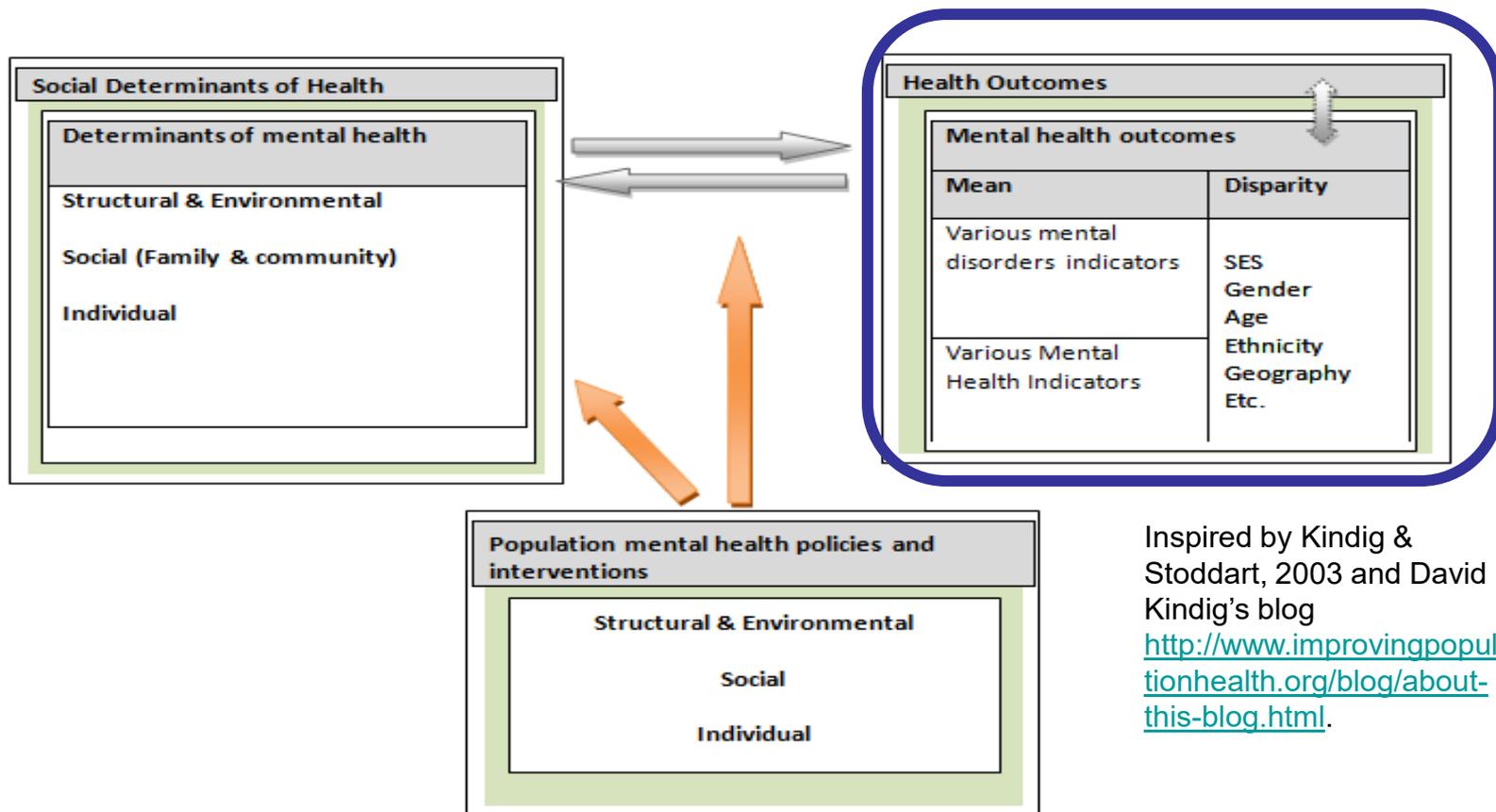

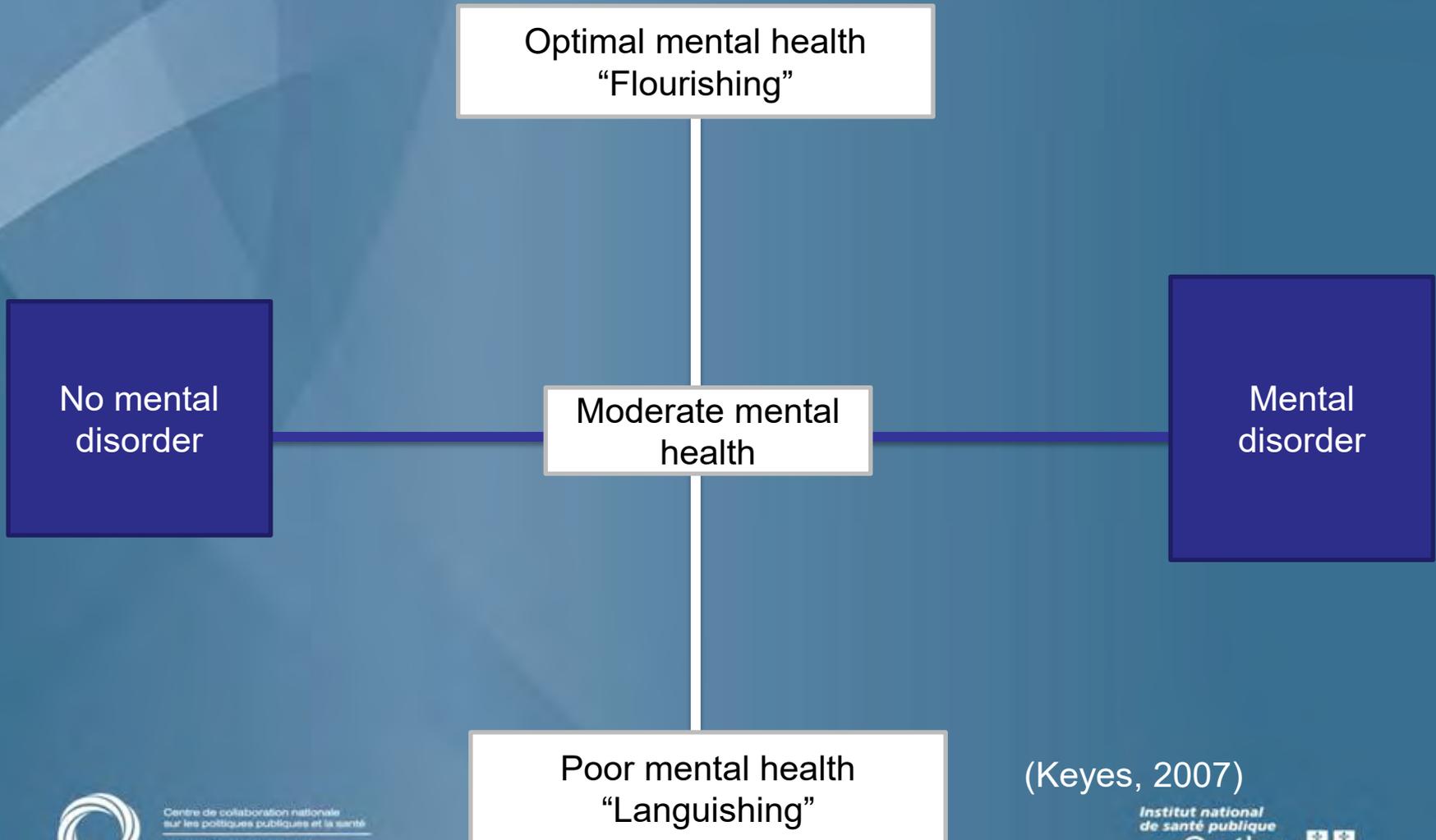

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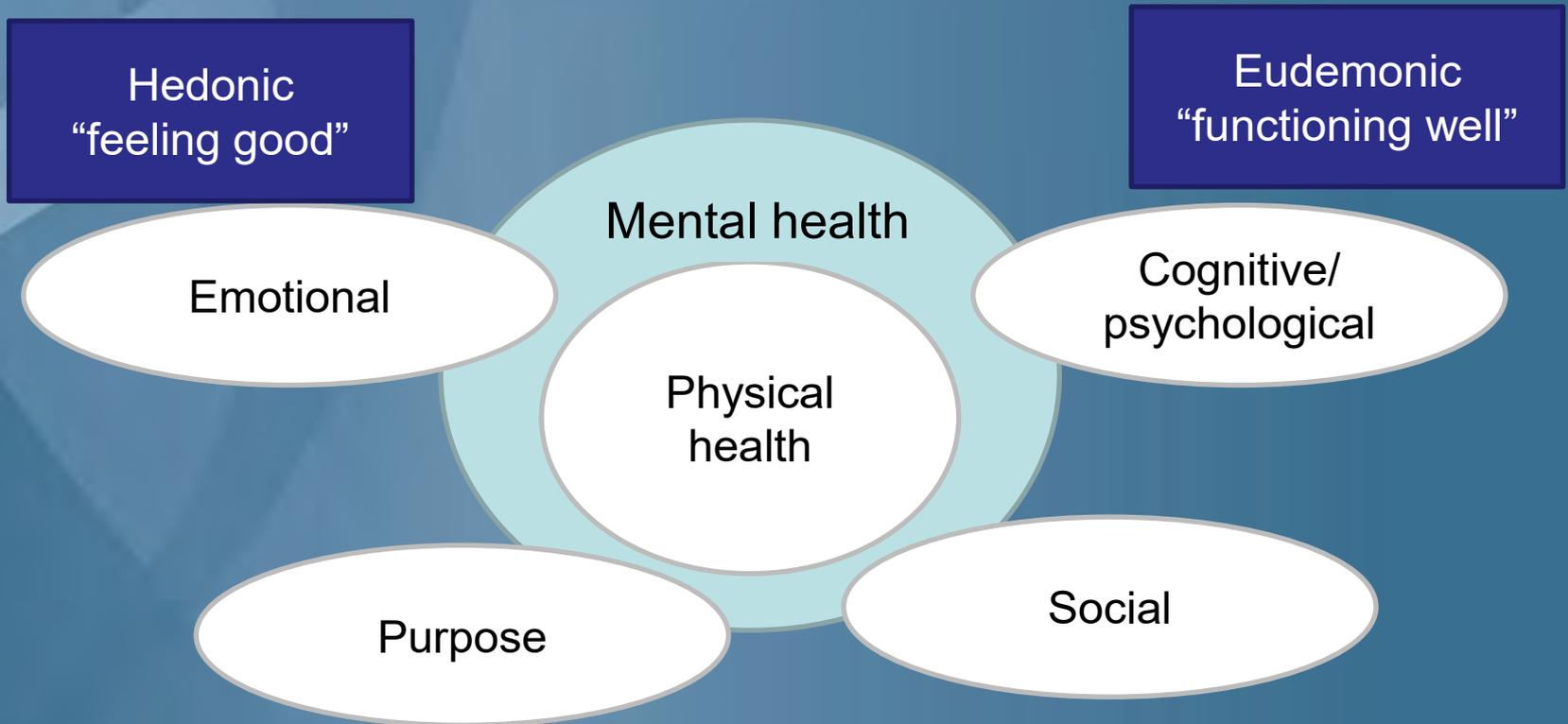
Mental Health / Mental Disorders Links

(Barry, 2009; Diener et al., 2009).

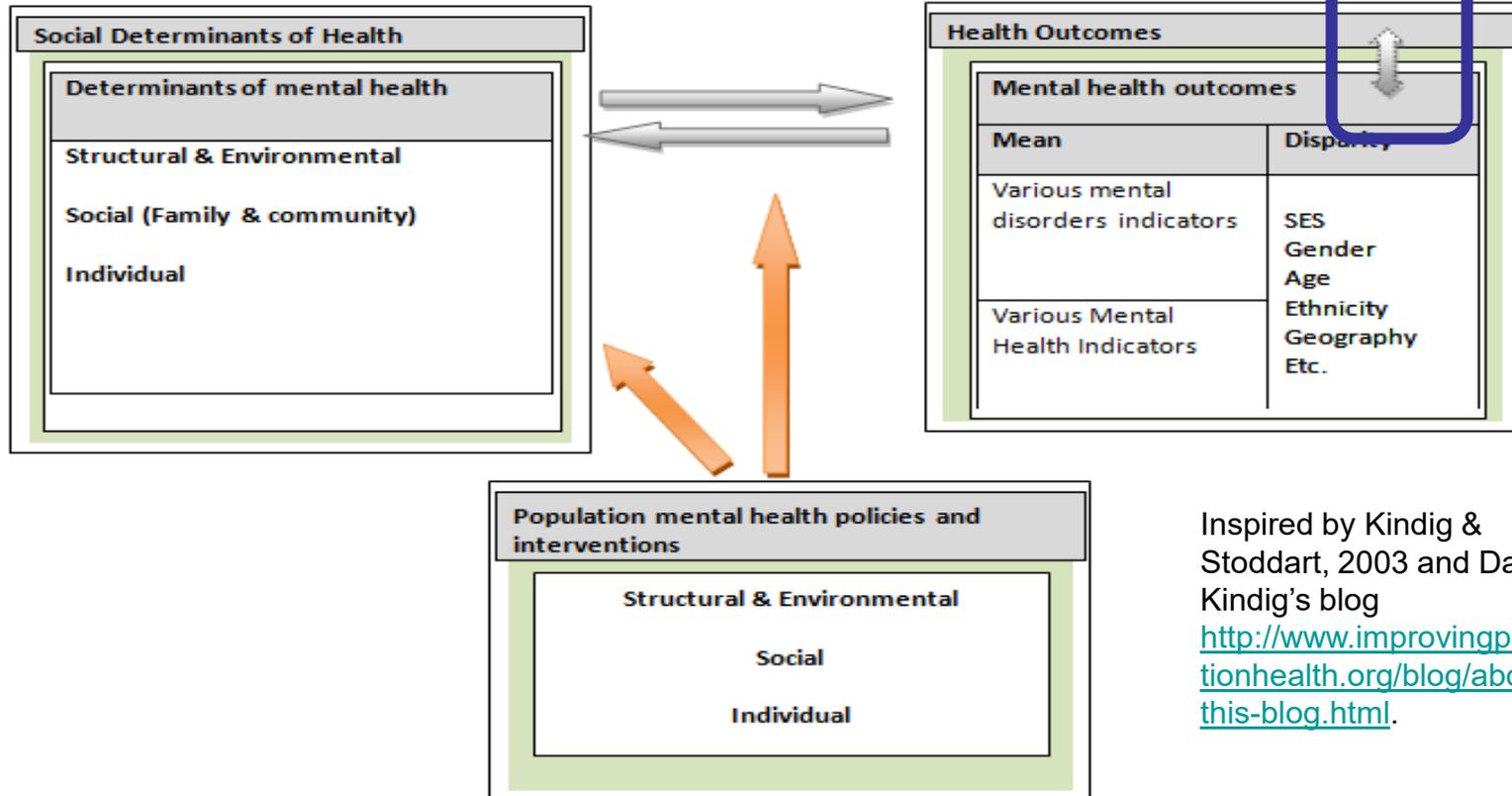


Population Distribution of Mental Health and Disorders

(Huppert, 2005; 2009)



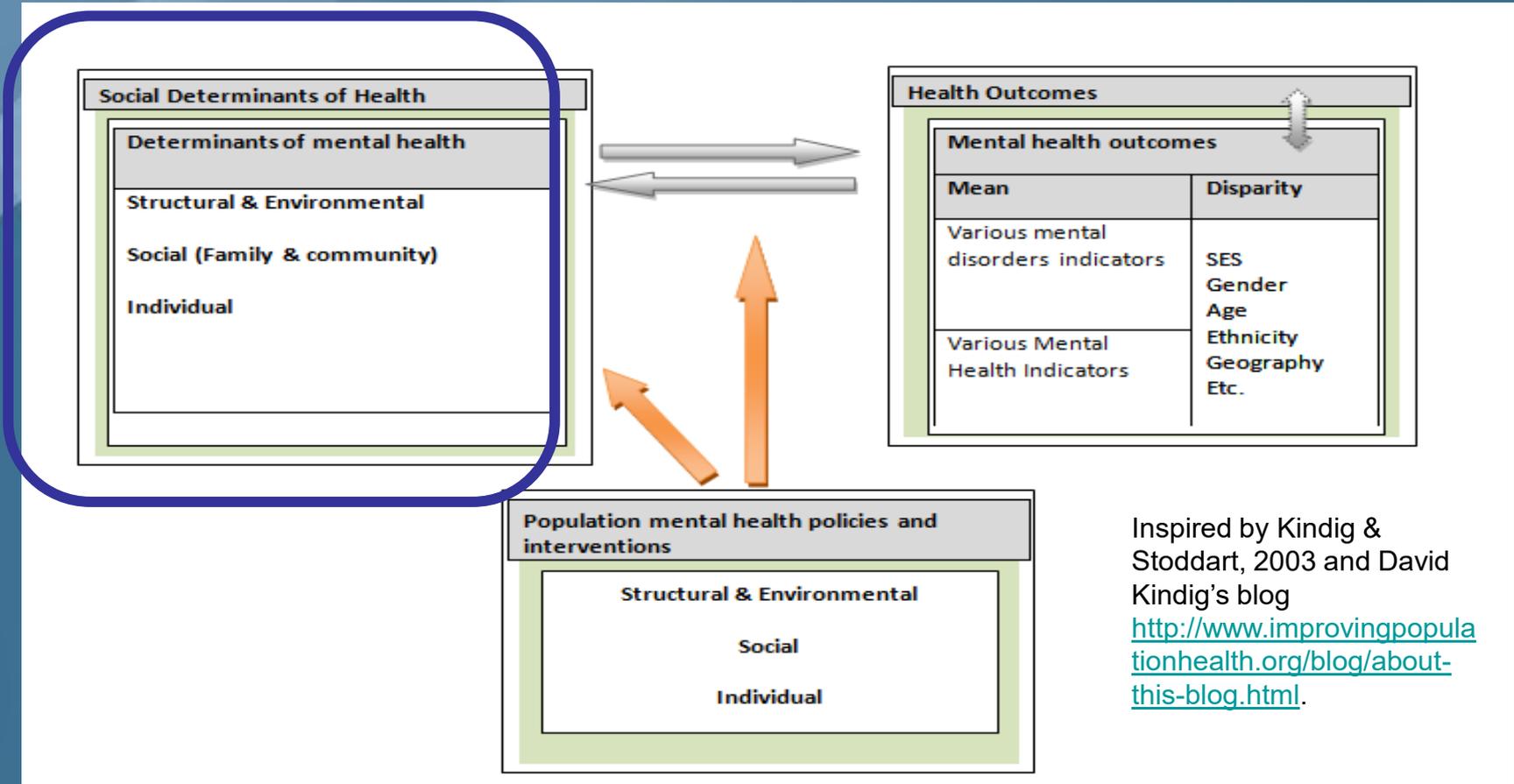

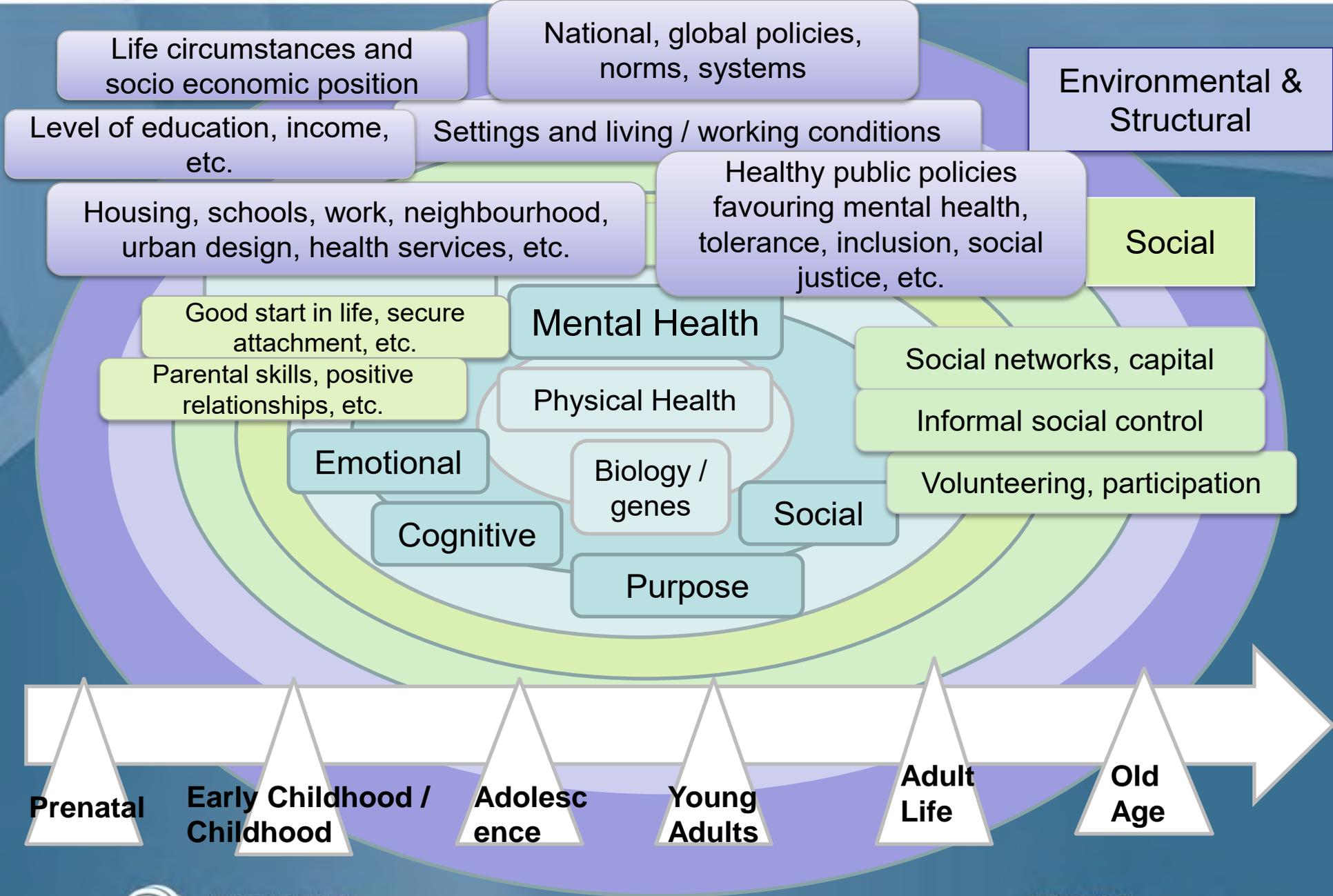


Framework on Population Mental Health for Public Health: Determinants of Mental Health

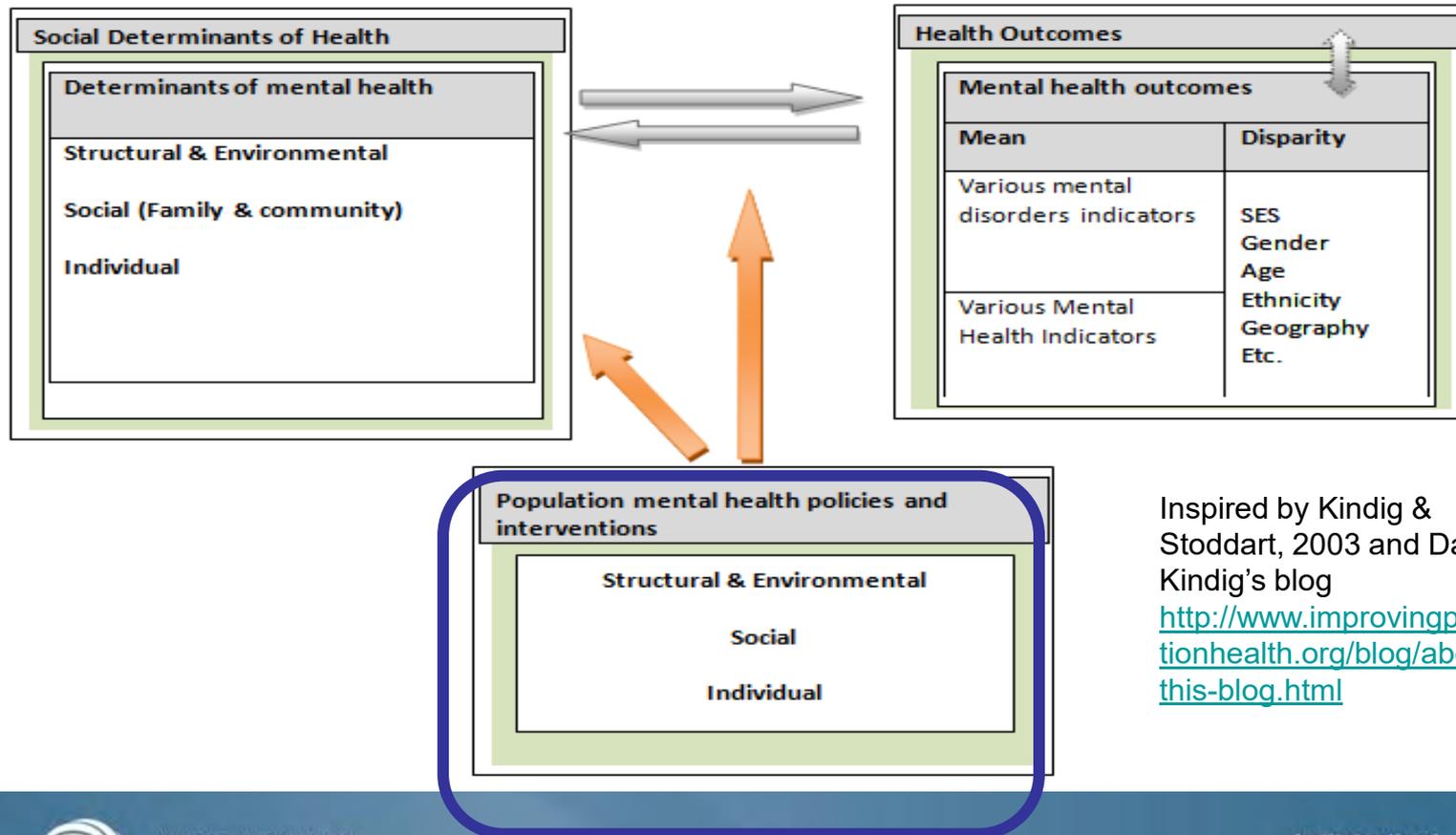

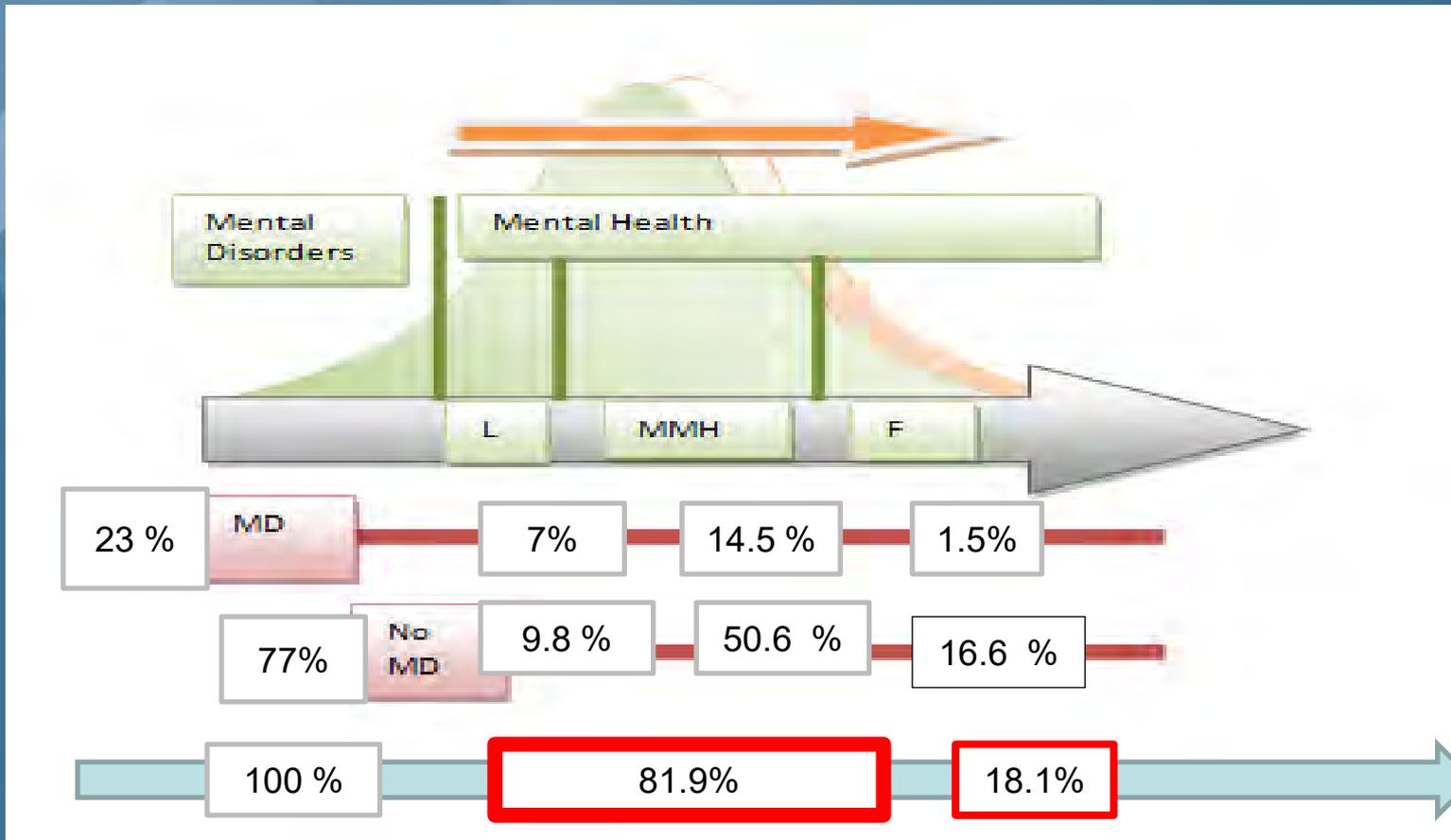


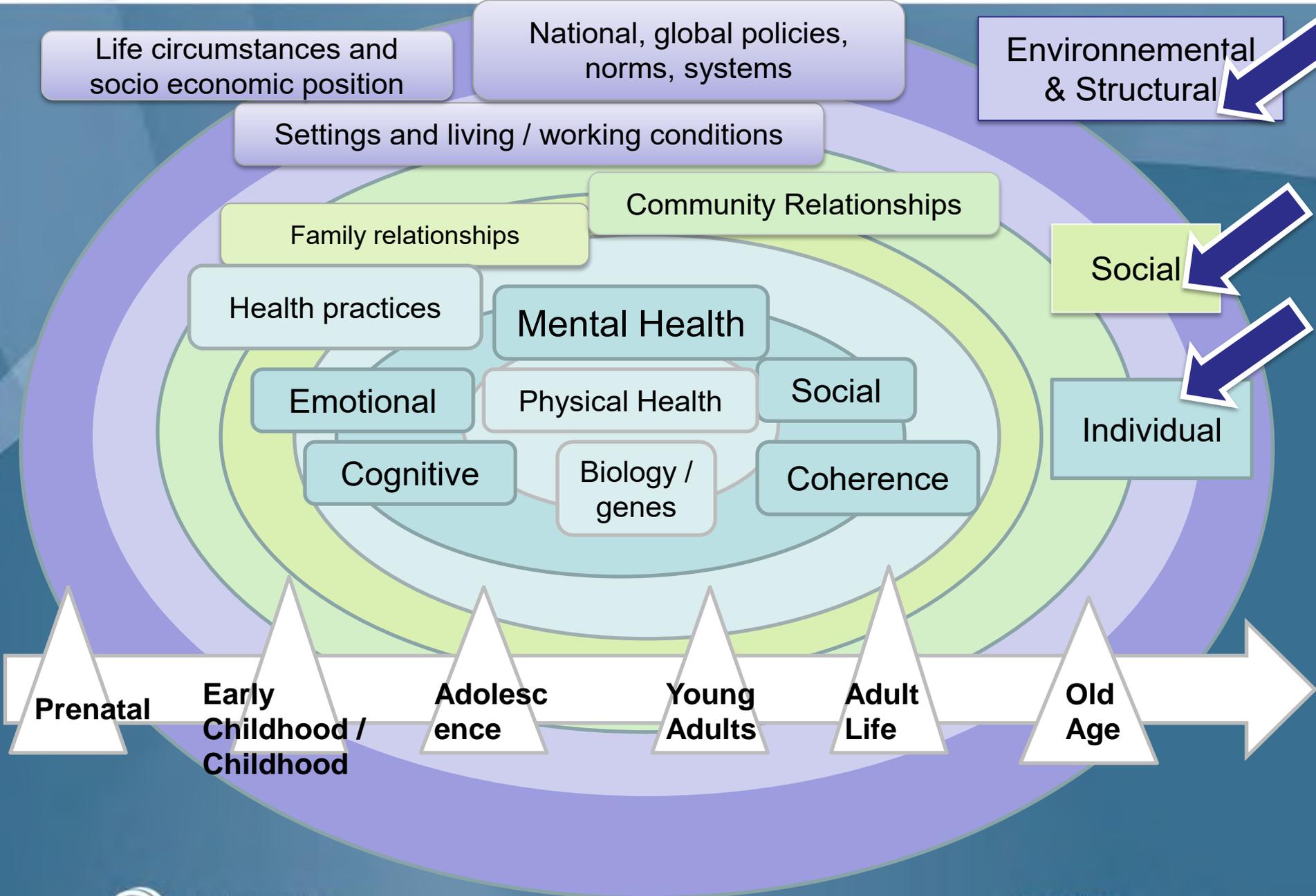

A Known Public Health Model





Interventions Aimed at the Individual Level

- Develop personal skills: psycho-social skills, resilience, job hunting skills, etc.
- Brief primary care interventions
- Lifestyles

Mental health professionals (psychologists, general practitioners, psychiatrists), public health nurses, health promoters, community organizations, decision makers, policy and municipal actors, etc.



Interventions Aimed at the Social Level

- Parenting skills: secure attachment, positive relationships from childhood to adolescence.
- Community interventions: community participation, development, social integration, volunteering, mutual support, etc.
- Environmental and structural interventions facilitating social contact (transport, urban design, influencing norms towards more tolerance, less discrimination, etc.

Health promoters, program planners, decision makers, community organisers, social workers, public health nurses, community organisations, decision makers in other sectors, municipal actors, etc.

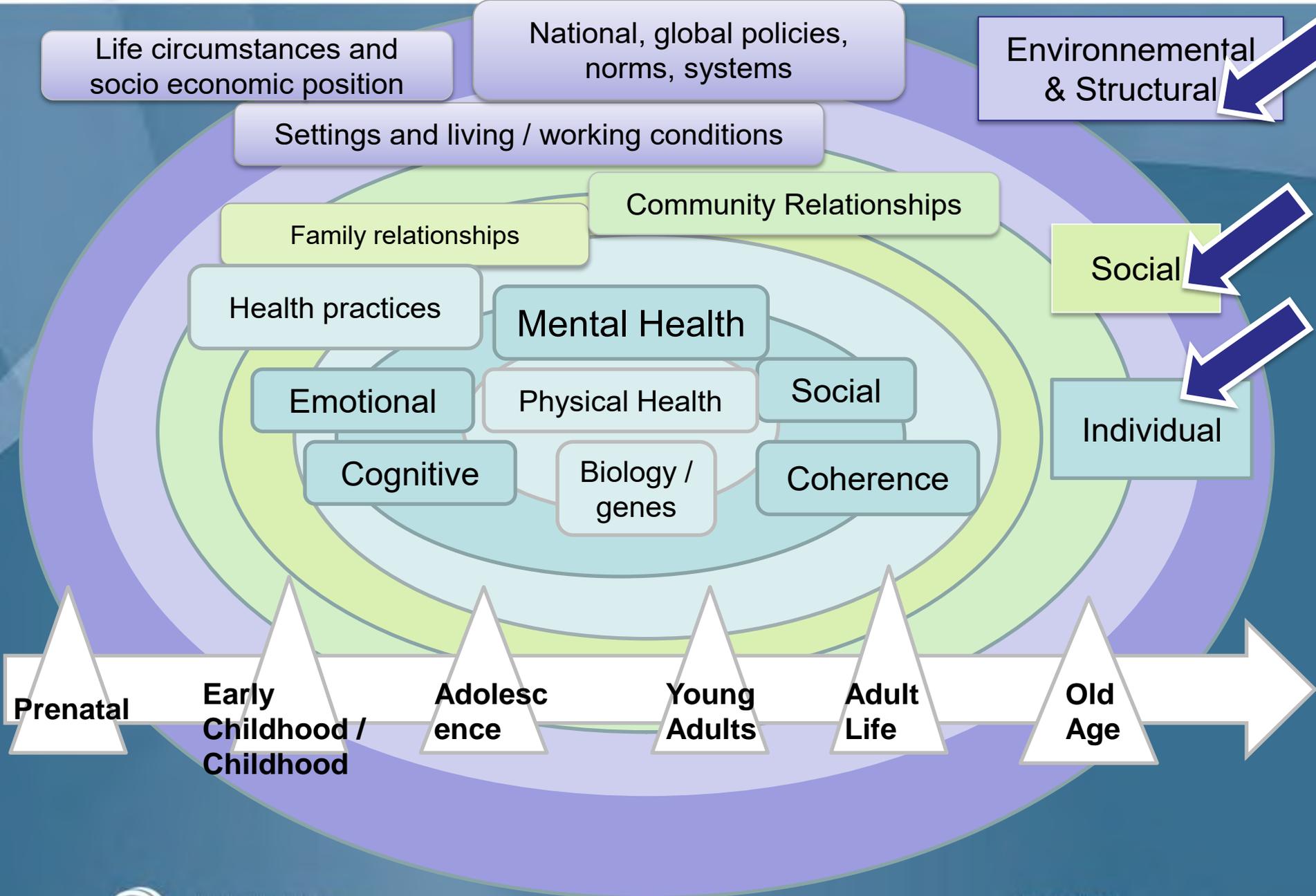


Interventions Aimed at Settings and Environments

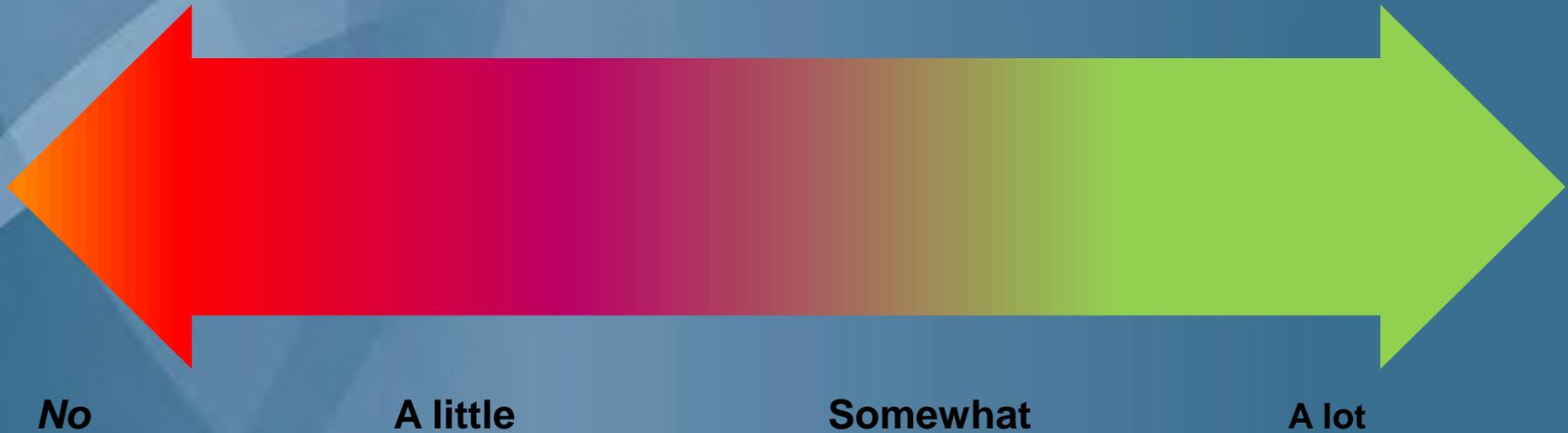
- Schools: whole school approaches
 - Transitions, continuous education
 - Child care / Day care
 - Work environments
 - Mental health services
 - Etc.
- Income
 - Education
 - Housing
 - Urban design
 - Transport
 - Inclusion
 - Tolerance
 - Social justice
 - Etc.

Decision makers, program planners and managers, researchers in public health and other sectors, health promoters, municipal actors, educators, first line mental health and health care professionals, and health care professionals in settings such as schools, universities, work settings, homes, etc.)

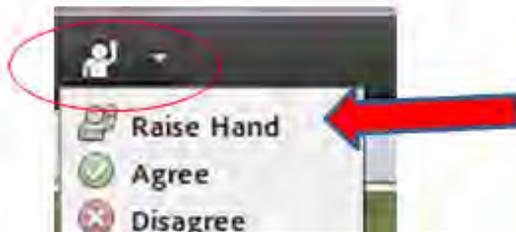
